Building Together Update as of June 8th

The Building Committee has selected Ellis Stone as the General Contractor for the Phase 1 project. They are busy working with the architect drawings to create the final detailed construction drawings. Ensuring great detail in the design process helps eliminate questions or change orders, thus causing delays, during the building process. Once the design/construction drawings phase is complete, all of the various components will go out to bid. The more complete the design/construction drawings phase the more competitive bids we will be able to obtain. This process will take 6 to 8 weeks.

In the meantime, the committee wishes to update you on the parking lot. Our main objective for the Inspired by the Spirit campaign was to raise enough money to re-do our parking lot. The more money we raised, the more that would come back to the parish to use toward our goal. While the campaign exceeded the goal set, the funds received to date (we can't count pledges not yet paid) are not enough to complete the entire parking lot. It is estimated that the project, which includes much more than just repaving, will cost at least \$150,000. The current pitch of the parking lot causes the drain off to pitch toward the church, which has to be changed. Total received by the parish as funds for our use from the Inspired by the Spirit campaign is \$112,977. There are several pledges set up on a monthly basis or others not yet remitted, but want you to be aware, we will be short when this project is slated to be completed.

As you have seen, the rectory has been removed and the water and electrical connections have been handled. On an exciting note, the church will be getting an entirely new HVAC system - yes, that means furnace and air conditioning!

The church is scheduled to be re-roofed in 2026.

A Minute with Jesus: The Holy Spirit and the Eucharist

Even after the Apostles had experienced the Risen Christ, they were afraid. They gathered with Mary on the day of Pentecost and prayed behind locked doors, waiting as instructed for the Gift of the Holy Spirit. After the Holy Spirit descended upon them on Pentecost, the Apostles were no longer afraid and were equipped to fulfill their role in bringing others to Jesus and His Church. It is the same for us today. When we receive the Eucharist, we also receive God the Holy Spirit, to abide in the depths of our hearts. If we allow Him, the Spirit of Truth will transform us and we will no longer be afraid, but be equipped with peace and strength for our role in God's plan. Let us then prepare for each Eucharistic encounter in the same way the Apostles prepared for Pentecost, "in prayer ... with Mary ..." (Acts 1:14).

Let's pray this right now and every day this week: the sequence for Pentecost

Come, Holy Spirit, come! And from Your celestial home shed a ray of light divine!

Come, Father of the poor! Come, source of all our store! Come, within our bosoms shine.

You, of comforters the best; You, the soul's most welcome guest; Sweet refreshment here below; In our labor, rest most sweet; Grateful coolness in the heat; Solace in the midst of woe. O most blessed Light divine, shine within these hearts of Yours, and our inmost being fill!

Where You are not, we have naught, nothing good in deed or thought, nothing free from taint of ill. Heal our wounds, our strength renew; On our dryness pour Your dew;

Wash the stains of guilt away: Bend the stubborn heart and will; Melt the frozen, warm the chill; Guide the steps that go astray. On the faithful, who adore and confess You evermore,

In your sevenfold gift descend; Give them virtue's sure reward; Give them your salvation, Lord; Give them joys that never end. Amen. Alleluia.
